Step One:


Identify gaps in knowledge

Use the PLC's to identify which topics you feel secure with.

Once you have RAG rated you can then begin choosing a topic to focus on.

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Step Two:

Once you have decided what topic you are going to focus on, identify the keywords or terms for that topic and make sure you know what they mean. Use dual coding if you can as this will help you remember them.



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Step Four:



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Step Five:


The Altar is the most important feature in the church -discuss
