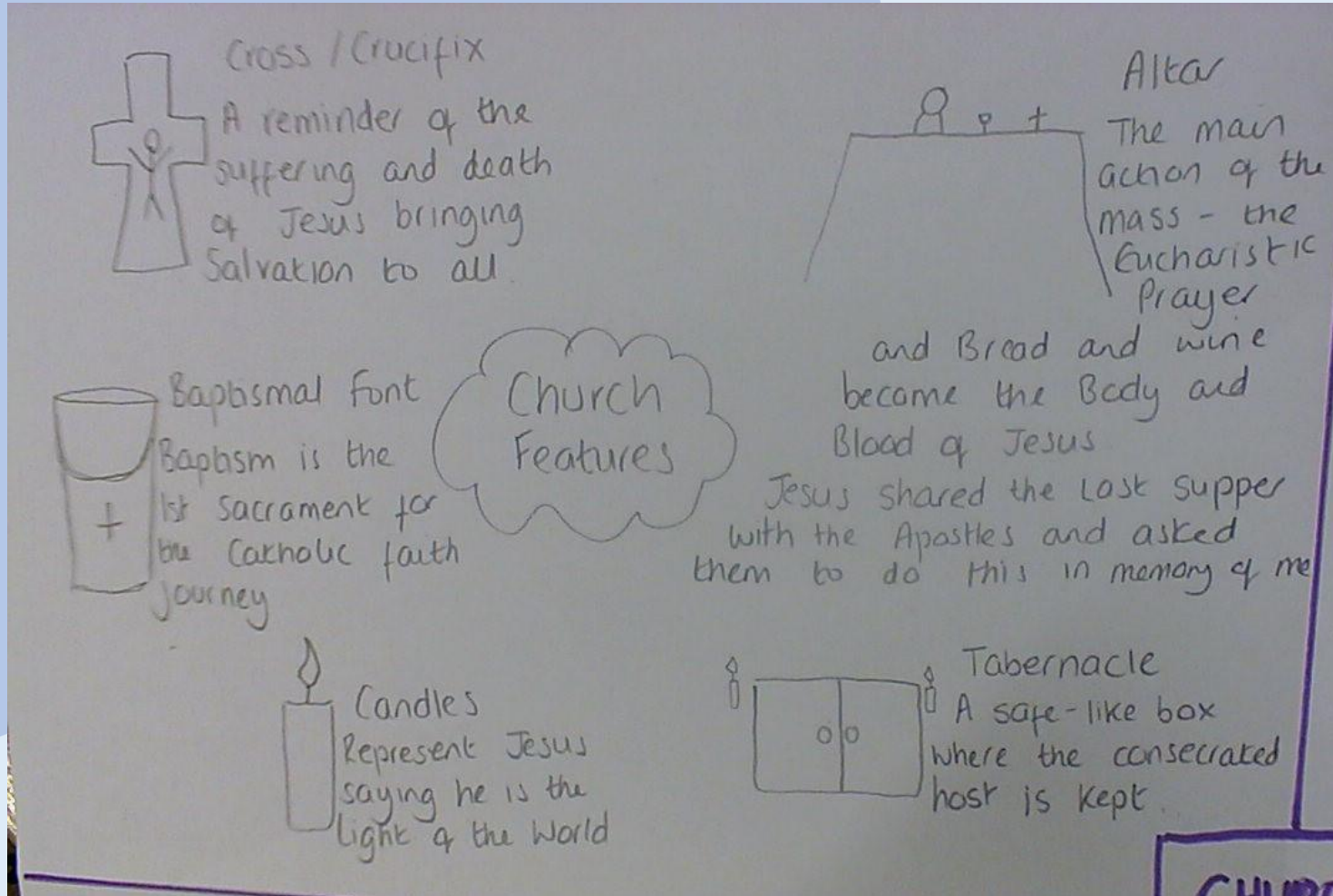
Use the PLC's to identify which topics you feel secure with.

Once you have decided what topic you are going to focus on, identify the keywords or terms for that topic and make sure you know what they mean. Use dual coding if you can as this will help you remember them.



Represent Jesus saying he is the Light of the World


Church Features

The main action of the Mass - the Eucharistic Prayer and Bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus
Jesus shared the Last Supper with the Apostles and asked them to do this in memory of me




