
HISTORY KS4: Year 9




Dictators of the 20th century

You will be studying the development of British society and especially looking at minority history for this Term. In 1:1 you will describe the conditions that existed in Whitechapel, London and the impact these conditions had on women. This will also let you gain an insight into the perception of women in the late 19th Century. You will then go on and look at the fight for Suffrage during the early part of the 20th Century and examine how far women have achieved equality today.

The Second World War

You will describe the causes of WW2, both long and short term and make complex links between Year 8 studies on WW1 and the outbreak of WW2. Our study will hinge on the idea of turning points in WW2. You will assess the significance of events such as Dunkirk, Battle of Britain, Barbarossa and D-Day. You will also get the opportunity to decide if the USA were right to drop the Atomic bombs on Japan.

The Holocaust

You will be studying the mass murder of European Jews during the Second World War. Your study will begin with an examination of antisemitism through history as well as other persecuted groups at the time. You will develop an understanding of the significance of the Holocaust by looking at first hand accounts of the event.
