We will learn to perform using non-traditional notation and Pentatonic scales. Pupils will also explore through voice how Korean Music has blended with western pop.


SUMMER 3:1

Personal Development – I can play Keyboard!

Pupils will now utilise their newly acquired keyboard and notation skills by working independently to create a solo performance of a piece of choice. Pupils will further explore wider complexities of timing, notation and key signatures.



SPRING 2:2



Pupils will begin to read musical notation, building on the rhythm unit at the start of the year. We will learn to read Treble Clef notation on the stave. Forming the necessary link between pitch and rhythm, pupils use their new notation skills to perform pop songs at the keyboard with correct handshapes, posture and expressive elements.

This unit builds on the previous exploration of how the body can make sound; this time we use our voices! We study our voice, techniques we can use for stylish delivery and we incorporate our vocals into performances of selected music.
