Definitions (2 marks) - Learn the meaning of the following

Prophet - a messenger of God who has been divinely inspired.

Messiah – a saviour from the line of King David. Jesus is known as the messiah in Christianity


Covenant - a promise or agreement between God and his people.

The teaching of Old Testament Prophets:

- 1. Hosea he taught that God was good, that he loved people and that he was always faithful. He said if people turned back to God he would forgive them. His name means salvation.
- 2. Amos- he was a shepherd. He taught that the rich should treat the poor well and be generous to them. He said if they did not do this that God would destroy the land of Israel. "Your sons and daughters shall fall on the sword"
- 3. Jeremiah he warned people that if they did not turn back to God they would be punished. He was thrown in a pit by people who didn't listen to him and as a result this prophecy came true and the city was destroyed. He was a young prophet. He wore a yoke around his neck so people saw his faith.
- 4. Isaiah Isaiah predicted God's plan and said that a Messiah would come to show people the way back to God. He said God was Almighty and a creator.

How Jews use objects to help them pray:

- Tallit A prayer shawl. The prayer shawl contains tassles which represent the 613 Mitzvot. Worn in the synagogue by Orthodox and some reform jews.
- 2. Kippah a hat. This is worn as a sign of respect at the top of your head which is the closest part to God.
- 3. Teffilin These are two small wooden boxes worn on the head and facing the heart. They contain the Shema a Jewish prayer about belief in one God. They show God is in the mind and heart of the Jewish people.
- 4. The Torah This is the Holy Scrolls. It is used in the synagogue to pray. It is God's word revealed to Moses.

The features of a synagogue:

- 1. Ner Tamid a light that is always burning near the Ark -reminds Jews of the presence of God in the Torah.
- 2. Bimah a raised platform from which the Torah is read which shows Jews God's word is higher than mans.
- 3. Ark A special container facing Jerusalem in the synagogue in which the five Torah scrolls of Genesis, Exodus, Numbers, Leviticus and Deuteronomy are kept. It protects and keeps God's word safe.
- 4. Ten Commandments These are on the wall often near the Ark and they are a reminder of the Covenant and the laws Jews have to live by. The first commandment is a reminder that they worship only one God.



Martin Luther king - modern day prophet

- 1. Martin spoke out against injustice. He fought for the right of Black people to vote in America.
- 2. He was a Christian and was doing God's will. He was a minister in the Baptist church and believed that everyone is equally made in God's image.
- 3. He believed that God was against racism and violence. He protested peacefully against the unfair rules.
- 4. Like the Old Testament Prophets, he made a change and spoke out using his I have a dream speech.
- 5. He followed Jesus' message to love your neighbour and your enemies.
