

You need your email address and password for the simple log-in process. Just follow the on-screen instructions. We will send you an email with a link to activate your log-in.

Search

You can give your views about your child's school if it is one of the following:

- a maintained school
 - an academy (including free schools)
- a non-association independent school inspected by Ofsted

To search for a school, just enter the name of the school and/or part of the address (road, city, town or postcode) in the search boxes when you are asked to.

Select your child's school from the search results.

Questionnaire

There will be a number of questions to answer, for example, 'My child is happy at this school' with a choice of responses:

- Strongly agree
- Agree
- Disagree
- Strongly disagree
- Don't know

Some questions have additional options that allow more information to be provided.

Use the 'Next' button to move to the next question. If you change your mind you can use the 'Previous' button to go back.

Once you have completed all questions, click on 'Finish' and the questionnaire is complete.

Alerts

Registered users can sign up to receive an email when the results for a specific provider become publicly available and when there is a change in the number of responses after this. You can choose the frequency of the alerts at set up and by going to your profile.








Year 10 - Miss H Oakman

PSHE





Students during their PSHE lessons this half-term are focusing on topics around the theme of 'Health & Wellbeing'. PSHE education helps children and young people to understand their own and others' emotions, develop healthy coping strategies and seek appropriate support, and talking openly about mental health issues is an effective means of breaking down any associated stigma.

What is Mindfulness?

Mindfulness is a practice that individuals and groups can do on a day-to-day basis. It can enable people to change the way they think and feel about their experiences, especially stressful experiences. As a mind-body approach, it can increase our ability to manage difficult situations and make wise choices.



What are the benefits of 'mindfulness'?

- Reduces stress, anxiety and depression.
- Improves holistic health including the mind, the brain, the body, and behaviour.
- Improves self-awareness, resilience.
- Helps improve your mental health.
- Helps people manage relationships with others.
- Makes the most of your potential.
- Helps you build coping skills.
