Student leadership suggestions for next year	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mrs Scanlon discussed that student leadership next year will be bigger and better, with students having more of a say. Student council reps will still be in place and will be voted for by the end of the second week back. We will also be having 2 (one boy one girl) junior student leaders for each year group and subject ambassadors who represent their subjects and support Heads of Department. Look out for information on how to apply in September. Students felt that subject ambassadors should be chosen by Heads of Department and Junior student leaders by Head of Year so that it was fair and not a popularity contest.• Students would like more lunchtime and after school clubs – it was suggested that these could be supported by subject ambassadors. AOB	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Mobile phones - Ms O'Connor mentioned that next academic year we will be hoping to bring in lunchtime rooms for each year group. We are looking at the idea of whether we would let students use their mobile phones in these rooms and provide some chargers, which would enable students to contact parents if needed without getting a sanction. This would be based on trust and if any student then broke the no phone rule around school then we would remove the room.2. Toilets – students would like air fresheners and the toilets to be nicer. It was commented that unfortunately due to poor behaviour around school this has not been possible. From September more toilets will be open at social time but only 2 toilets open during lessons. We will be monitoring which students are leaving lessons to go to the toilet.3.
