 Business wear trousers which are full-length or ankle-length and have a tailored style should not be tight.  Business suit consisting of matching jacket and trousers of the same material, colour and pattern. Business collared shirt. Shirts should be smart of a plain single colour, discreet thin striped or regular small patterned, worn with top buttons done up and shirts tucked in. Smart shoes or boots that are formal, and dark in colour. Boot type shoes are allowed provided they are worn under, not over trousers. Suit jackets must be worn at all times in school 	 Polo shirts/T shirts Hooded tops are not allowed. No trainers or canvas shoes. Accessories

- Coats: Should be plain and formal.
