






Revision Timetables - why have one?


Examination Guidance

Period 6

- Period 6 will run Monday-Friday.
- Monday and Friday and every second Thursday will be options.
- Tuesday Science, Wednesday- Maths, Every second Thursday English.
- Students will receive their timetable for Period 6 every Monday and this will be in their personal organise, please use this as a tool to check when they should be attending.
- Each week a text message will go home sharing with parents when their child is due to have period 6 that week.
- Parents will receive a phone call the next day if their child does not attend period 6







Ensure students have a suitable study space that should include:


- A proper place to work a desk, kitchen table etc
