

SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE 2020-2021

Girls should wear:

- A suit consisting of a matching jacket and skirt, trousers or dress of the same material, colour and pattern
- Suit trousers which are full-length or ankle-length
- Skirts or dresses of a suitable length and no shorter than just above the knee
- A blouse or top of any colour
- Discreet make-up
- **SUIT JACKETS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES IN SCHOOL**

Girls should *not* wear:

- Short or tight skirts, dresses or trousers, including body-con skirts and dresses
- Denim, leather or leather-look clothing
- Jeans/shorts/leggings/chinos/cropped trousers
- Footless tights
- Denim, combat or jogging trousers
- Revealing clothing of any type: tops must not be too strappy, reveal the midriff or expose the chest
- Ugg boots, Dr Marten's boots, biker boots, trainers and canvas or Converse shoes are not permitted

Boys should wear:

- A suit consisting of a matching jacket and trousers of the same material, colour and pattern.
- Collared shirt and smart tie: Shirts should be smart of a plain single colour, discreet thin striped or regular small patterned, worn with top buttons done up and shirts tucked in.
- Smart shoes or boots that are formal, smart and dark in colour. Boot type shoes are allowed provided they are worn under, not over trousers.
- **SUIT JACKETS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES IN SCHOOL**

Boys should *not* wear:

- **Polo shirts/T shirts**
- **Hooded tops are not allowed.**
- **No trainers or canvas shoes.**
- **Denim, leather or leather-look clothing**
- **Jeans/shorts/chinos/cropped trousers**
- **Combat or jogging trousers**
- **Dr Marten's boots, biker boots, trainers and canvas or Converse shoes are not permitted**

Male and Female Accessories

- **Coats:** Should be plain and formal.
- **Jewellery:** Sixth form students are permitted to wear jewellery but are asked to keep it minimal and discreet.
- **Make-up:** Light, subtle make-up may be worn.
- **Hair colour:** No extreme styles allowed.
- **Head Coverings:** No headwear indoors, except religious head coverings which should be plain dark or white in colour.
