


Student leadership Structure 2023-24

Job description and person specification – Junior student leadership roles

Key attributes needed to be a student leader:

- Confidence and the ability to communicate effectively
- Skills in Leadership and team work
- Reliability and dedication
- Ability to inspire other students and command the respect of peers
- Passionate about school improvement and representing the views of all students
- Effective communicator – able to listen to the concerns and views of students and represent them to senior leaders and the senior student leadership team
- Willing to work with others to improve the school community
- Have a mature attitude

Job descriptions for each role:

<p>Student council representative</p> <p>2 per tutor group (one boy and one girl)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Represent your tutor group on key issues • Represent their year group at school council meetings with commitment and full attendance. • Report back to their tutor groups following year council and wider school council meetings. • Believe in the importance of representing their year group's point of view even if they do not agree with it themselves. • Initiate discussion and debate with fellow student representatives and understand the importance of teamwork.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand that as a school council representative, they have the obligation to participate in making decisions about the school, along with staff and school governors. • Attend school council meetings and year council meetings when invited. • Lead student council pastoral sessions with their tutor group in an unbiased manner and take on the views of all students • Attend planning meetings where required for student council meetings.
Junior student leader Two per year group (one boy and one girl)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You will lead and represent the student body at school wide functions, such as Open Evenings and Parents' Evenings, meeting with and talking to adults and students. • You will be expected to lead school wide tours for visitors and to answer questions as well as share the school's vision with visitors. • You will be expected to speak in front of parents and members of the leadership team, discussing your experiences and sharing the ideas of students in a formal manner. • Attend half termly meetings with your Head of Year • To represent and speak for all students in school, on issues that are important to the student body, to leadership when given the opportunity. • To meet with the senior student leadership team, to discuss key issues and represent your year group on issues • To lead on assemblies where required • Any other duties that your Head of Year requests • Contribute towards the school newsletter

<p>A variety of students across year groups per subject (between 10 and 15 across the school for each subject)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supporting learning through lunchtime clubs & revision sessions. • Mentoring small groups of school students in lower years • Meets Head of department once a term to discuss any concerns/ issues. • Will approach Head of department with any questions from the class. • Can feedback ideas from the class to the class teacher by completing student voice • Come up with ideas for promoting and improving the subject • Updating display boards • Research possible subject trips and out of school competitions • Contribute towards the school newsletter
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
