The Pupil Premium funding, which is provided for students in receipt of free school meals, children looked after and also students with a parent currently serving/or having served in the armed forces in the last six years, is allocated to the school to address the issues associated with social disadvantage and support those students working below the expected levels for Cardinal Newman Catholic School. The aim of the funding is to narrow and eventually close any differences between their attainment and that of all students. When making appropriate provision for these children we also acknowledge that not all students in receipt of Pupil Premium are educationally disadvantaged. Qualifying pupils in 2020-21 result in the school receiving a grant of the amount £294,617. The Senior Leader responsible for overseeing our pupil premium students is Assistant Headteacher, Mr Nicholas Versey (nicholas.versey@cncs.school)

What are our Principles?

Through our work as a Catholic School it is our firm belief that the rights of all children are upheld and that those with more support needs or who are disadvantaged receive the relevant support in order for them to achieve their full potential.

In our context, some Pupil Premium students flourish but others have the following barriers to achieving in school, highlighted by performance, attendance and behaviour data as well as frequent discussions with the students themselves:
