The aim of Prevent is to stop people from becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism. Prevent also extends to supporting the rehabilitation and disengagement of those already involved in terrorism.

Police Prevent Officers

Coventry currently has a dedicated team of police prevent officers whose primary safeguarding role is to prevent susceptible people becoming involved in violent extremism of all kinds. (As per Shawcross recommendations).

The team help tackle terrorism by building strong links with local communities thus making them resilient to the extremist narrative.

The team work alongside Neighbourhood Policing Teams to support local citizens, community groups, educational establishments and partner organisations with understanding issues around all forms of extremism. The team can help to support practitioners with practical materials such as toolkits, workshops and presentations.
