**Re: Year 10 Narrative Writing**

We hope you and your family are well.

Following the Year 10 English Language mock examination, we would like to update you on your child's progress in preparing their narrative for the assessment.

Unfortunately, your child did not demonstrate that they had learned or used their prepared narrative in the mock exam. As a result, they did not access the full range of marks available for this section. It is essential that your child now puts sustained effort into learning their narrative and practising how to adapt it so it links effectively to the specific task set in the exam.

To support them with this, we will be revisiting narrative writing skills during tutor-time intervention sessions and in Period 6 English lessons. Your child is expected to attend these sessions and engage fully so that they can make the necessary improvements.

We kindly ask for your support at home in ensuring that your child learns their narrative thoroughly. Regular practice such as reading the narrative aloud, rewriting it from memory, or testing key sections will make a significant difference to their confidence and performance in the next assessment.

If you require an additional copy of your child's prepared narrative to support them with revision at home, please email your child's English teacher, who will be happy to send this to you.

Students will complete a Component 2 mock examination during the first week back after the Christmas break, followed by a further round of mock exams in the spring term. Please find below a reminder of the confirmed GCSE English Language exam dates:

- **Component 1:** Thursday 21 May 2026
- **Component 2:** Friday 5 June 2026
