# What to look for when choosing Sixth Form



Of course, we hope you decide to stay here at Cardinal Newman but we know that this is a big decision and we want you to make the right one. Here are our top ten areas to consider:

## • Results

You need to be confident that you will be able to get the results you will need to progress to your chosen university, apprenticeship or employment. Schools will summarise how many students achieved A\*/A, A\* - B and A\* - E grades. Don't forget that getting the best grades is about being in an environment that is both academically stimulating and also offers excellent pastoral support.

## • Destinations

What are students doing after they finish? Does this include the pathway or university that you are interested in? Are many students progressing to degree apprenticeships?

## • Support with university applications

Every student applying to university will submit a formal Personal Statement. It is important to consider the assistance you will receive in crafting this document. You also need to know what support is available for any specialist entrance tests or interview preparation.

## • Apprenticeship support

This is a growing destination for many students that might be right for you. Find out what degree apprenticeship destinations are available.

## • The timetable

It's important to consider how many teaching hours you are given per subject. The more time you have in lessons the better chance you will achieve your potential. Class size may influence how much individual support you receive.

## • Subjects

Consider which subjects you need for your university or apprenticeship pathway that suit both your interest and academic ability. You should find out what the subject content is and if you will be assessed through exams or coursework or both. You should be provided with detailed information about your chosen course.

## • Support

A sixth form bridges the gap between school and university or apprenticeship. Although greater independence and learning autonomy is encouraged we know that students still need support as they adjust to this new mindset. Some sixth forms offer supervised study periods where you can get your homework and revision completed. It is also useful if there are facilities for after school study.

## • Enrichment

When it comes to making applications for university and degree apprenticeships it is the extra or supra curricular activities that will make an application stand out from the crowd.

## • Culture

The key to success in life is attitude and values, not knowledge or skills alone. Check that the values and ethos are right for you.

## • Location

Make sure you have a good travel plan that is sustainable for the duration of your course. How far away is the college to you? What are the transport options and costs? When would you need to leave and arrive and how long will it take? How could you get there in the event of disruptions?
