Year 7-10 PSHE Drop-down session 24/06/26.

Dear Parent/Carer,

We hope you and your family are well at this time.

As part of your child's education at Cardinal Newman Catholic School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through our comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

As part of the curriculum, students across Year 7 to 10 are currently completing work on Health and Wellbeing covering topics such as keeping yourself safe online, developing good friendships, peer pressure and the impacts of substance use. Pupils have opportunities to ask questions which are answered factually and, in an age-appropriate manner. Each pupil's privacy is respected, and no one is asked to reveal personal information.

PSHE education is taught across all key stage 3, 4 and 5 through our pastoral programme but we have included a drop-down session for each half-term throughout the academic year to ensure all students have accurate information to be able to keep themselves safe as they progress through life.

The next whole school PSHE drop-down session will take place on Wednesday 24th June during tutor and period 1. The topics that will be explored during this morning are:

10	Work Experience Preparation.
