



Student Council Updates Miss Cunningham

Being a student councillor is <u>not</u> an easy job, however it will be very rewarding and beneficial for you. Here's what you need to do:

- If you're interested in being a student council representative, you will either need to write a speech that will be delivered to the rest of your tutor group OR make a persuasive promotional video that will be shown during tutor time!
- Once all the candidates have delivered their speeches/ shown their videos, each student will be given a polling card where you will vote on which two students you want to be your council representatives!
- You will then take your poll cards to the polling stations and the votes will be counted.

What skills do you need to have to be a student council representative?

- Be enthusiastic
- Have resilience
- Have patience
- Have collaboration skills to work with others
- Good communication skills
- Being strong-willed
- Have a passion for the student voice
- Be innovative (have new ideas!)

Eco-Schools Green flag award

Pupils at Cardinal Newman have earned an international accreditation this academic year, recognising their amazing work in making the school and community more environmentally friendly and raising ecoawareness in fellow pupils.







Pupils collaborated with the Geography Department to conduct an environmental review, assessing how ecofriendly the school is. They reviewed everything from the school's recycling practices, to energy usage, to how environmental themes are covered in classrooms. 



General Attendance


As a general reminder, attendance at school is compulsory every day. Missing school has serious consequences on the ability to engage with school life and learning. Whilst we do understand that illness can result in a student missing time from their education, every 5% reduction in attendance is two weeks of absence over the entire year. Low attendance results in large gaps in understanding and a decline in achievement. Please help by ensuring that your child attends school every day and on time.


Year 11 – Mr Poole






