Assessment style/questions:

Students will be given 4 exam style essay questions to complete 3. These are in a statement evaluative style and are worth 40 marks each. Equivalent of a full A level paper in 2 hours. Students will have to revisit all 6 topics

Grade in Mock exam to assess appropriate intervention for year 13 content
