Option Taking Process

Option Selection Process

- If students know what they want to select by the end of the evening, then you have a paper copy that can be completed and handed in tonight. The completed forms can be put into the box in the canteen or library.


Tonight is the opportunity to ask those questions to subject staff so that your child is better informed in their selection of their option subject.

Some questions to think about:

- 1. How is the course assessed? (e.g. all exams or coursework)
- 2. What topics are included in the course?
- 3. Which subjects are you good at?
- 4. What key skills do you need to have to study the subject?
- 5. What careers/next steps will the subject lead to?



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Core Curriculum

Some subjects at GCSE are compulsory, so all students have to study them. All students at Cardinal Newman School will study at GCSE:

- English Language & GCSE Literature
- Mathematics
- Science
- Religious Education
- Core Physical Education (non examined)
- PSHE (non examined)





Step 1: Students choose either Geography or History



- At Cardinal Newman School students will either select GCSE Geography or History as part of our curriculum model.
- The government recommends that all students choose a humanities subject as part of a broad and balanced curriculum

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The next thing to consider is which courses are best suited to you:

GCSE Courses – 'Traditional' courses which include a mix of theoretical study, investigative and practical work. Courses are usually assessed through written examinations.

Vocational Courses (BTEC and Cambridge National) – More vocational in content which develops practical skills and knowledge. Courses are assessed through practical work and the creation of portfolio evidence but also include an exam.



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The English Baccalaureate Pathway:


- The EBacc is not a qualification in its own right it's a combination of GCSE subjects, including a language, that offer an important range of knowledge and skills to young people.
- Students who take this pathway will study English, Maths, Science, History or Geography and a Language plus one other option.
- Other languages that qualify for this pathway include:

If your child speaks an additional language at home, then there may be an opportunity to complete additional lessons on this outside of the normal school day and complete a GCSE in that language






The form can also be completed on paper and handed in tonight, in the box located in the canteen and library

- Don't think that choosing subject at GCSE plans out your whole future



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


What's next....
